Nomination criteria:

- ♦ **A recipient of the SON Hall of Fame Award**
- ♦ Nationally or internationally recognized for their health care efforts
- ♦ Member of the Alumni Association or is willing to become a member and has actively contributed to the Alumni Assn
- ♦ Distinguished in the nursing profession
- ♦ Conducted research, published articles or made comparable significant impact on health care
- ♦ Has made significant contributions to the nursing profession in clinical practice, education, administration, or organizational work involving health care or innovation in health care delivery systems.
- ♦ Has made important contributions to his/her community
- ♦ Demonstrates pride in the University of Texas Medical Branch and whose loyalty and interest are evident
- ♦ Include Curriculum Vitae (CV) for nominee

Please note: Those who are nominated for SON Distinguished Alumnus may be considered for Hall of Fame, should they not meet all SON Distinguished Alumnus criteria.

Hall of Fame

Nomination criteria:

- ♦ Member of the Alumni Association or is willing to become a member
- ♦ Distinguished in the nursing profession
- ♦ Has conducted research, published articles or made comparable significant impact on health care
- ♦ Has made significant contributions to the nursing professional in clinical practice, education, administration, or organizational work involving health care or innovation in health care delivery systems.
- ♦ Demonstrates pride in the University of Texas Medical Branch and whose loyalty and interest are evident.
- ♦ Include Curriculum Vitae (CV) for nominee

For both awards, **please include a statement supporting your nomination of this individual** for the award indicated.

Your nomination should not exceed two pages and may include up to two (2) attachments from others in support of the nomination. Support documents should also be limited to two pages. Nominations and support documents should describe how the individual meets the criteria for these awards. Please use specific examples to demonstrate how the individual meets or exceeds the criteria. Highlight accomplishments that demonstrate commitment to the criteria. **Please include a CV for the nominee.**

Do not include booklets, books, brochures or similar documents.

Incomplete packets will not be considered and is the responsibility of the nominator.

Nominations of those not selected will be held for a period of three years and will be eligible for reconsideration, yearly, with updated information.
